





Learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage

Children in the EYFS learn by playing and exploring, being active, and through creative and critical thinking which takes place both indoors and outside.

We aim to provide an environment that is stimulating and exciting. We firmly believe children learn best through play. We ensure that children get a good balance of activities, using the Foundation Stage Curriculum.

There are seven areas of learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum:



Personal, Social & Emotional Development



Personal, social and emotional development involves helping children to develop a positive sense of themselves, and others; to form positive relationships and develop respect for others; to develop social skills and learn how to manage their feelings; to understand appropriate behaviour in groups; and to have confidence in their own abilities.













Communication and Language

Communication and language development involves giving children opportunities to experience a rich language environment; to develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves; and to speak and listen in a range of situations.







Physical Development


Physical development involves providing opportunities for young children to be active and interactive; and to develop their co-ordination, control, and movement. Children are also helped to understand the importance of physical activity, and to make healthy choices in relation to food.















P.E. (Physical Education)

- With physical health a priority, more time is being given to staying active in school. We incorporate finger gym, scissors, tripod grip and threading activities in our provision.
- Our year group's PE lessons are timetabled for <u>Wednesday</u>.
- Pupils are encouraged to come into school that day in their PE kits to avoid bringing additional bags into school.
- As part of PE will also teach the children about making healthy food choices.





Literacy

Literacy development involves encouraging children to link sounds and letters and to begin to read and write. Children are given access to a wide range of reading materials (books, poems, and other written materials) to ignite their interest.














Phonics

- The school follows the Read Write Inc. scheme to teach Phonics. The children will learn Set 1 and Set 2 Sounds in Reception.
- During Phonics the children will be learning to blend and read green words. The children will also learn to read high frequency words such I, the and said.
- Once your children learn the first few sounds they'll start to read Red Ditty Books. It's very important to read with your child everyday at home.



Reading

- Every Friday the children will swap their level book and library book. Please ensure your child comes with their reading books on that day so they can be exchanged for new ones.
- We also strongly encourage parents to complete a book review to help your child to understand the story by asking them questions such as what was their favourite part.





Reading

At North Beckton, we know the importance of reading daily and the benefits this has to not only your child's education, but also their well-being.

Children will have their reading records regularly monitored to check they are reading daily for 20 minutes.

If children are not reading, there is a a 3-step procedure at North Beckton.

- 1) Your child's teacher will ring you up to have a discussion about reading at home.
- 2) You will be invited in to a meeting to discuss reading at home.
- 3) Your child will be invited to a daily reading club during lunch time.

Children can be exposed to 1.8 million words in each school year if they read for 20 minutes each day.





Mathematics

Mathematics involves providing children with opportunities to develop and improve their skills in counting, understanding and using numbers, calculating simple addition and subtraction problems; and to describe shapes, spaces, and measures.












Understanding of the World

Understanding the world involves guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community through opportunities to explore, observe and find out about people, places, technology and the environment.











Expressive Arts and Design

Expressive arts and design involves enabling children to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials, as well as providing opportunities and encouragement for sharing their thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance, role-play, and design and technology.











Topic

Throughout the year we will be also having Topic lessons to explore Science, History and Geography as part of our Reception curriculum.

For example by exploring the world around us by going outdoors. Such as learning about how to identify different seasons, learning about our senses and exploring light and dark.














Forest Schools


Once a week we will explore and learn in the outdoor area no matter what the weather!

How can you help with your child's learning?



- All homework will be on Google Classrooms on Friday.
- Reading regularly with your child (you reading to them + listening to them read).
- Tell the class teacher if there is anything that you think may affect your child during the school day. For example, if they didn't sleep well, or if something has happened at home or in the family.

Please be aware that in Reception we do a lot of messy activities. Your child may come home with mud and paint on their uniform! This shows that they are having fun and learning lots!
