



**YEAR 3 - Week Beginning 6.7.20**

- Our spelling learning this week is looking at words with silent letters, such as the 'k' in 'knife'. Use the look, cover and write sheet to practise and then test yourself with the word search.
- This week for grammar we are focusing on prefixes - use the worksheet to practise identifying the which prefix you should use, then rewrite the word with the prefix attached.
- Write a poem about your favourite animal. Create an 'ABAB' rhyme scheme. For example, the last words for four lines could be cat (A), milk (B), fat (A), silk (B).
