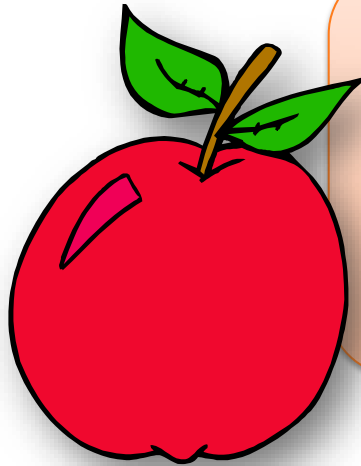
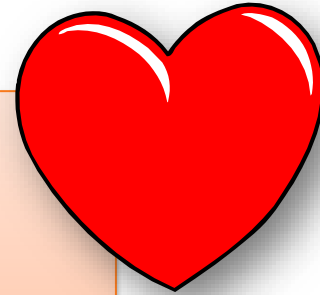

an apple

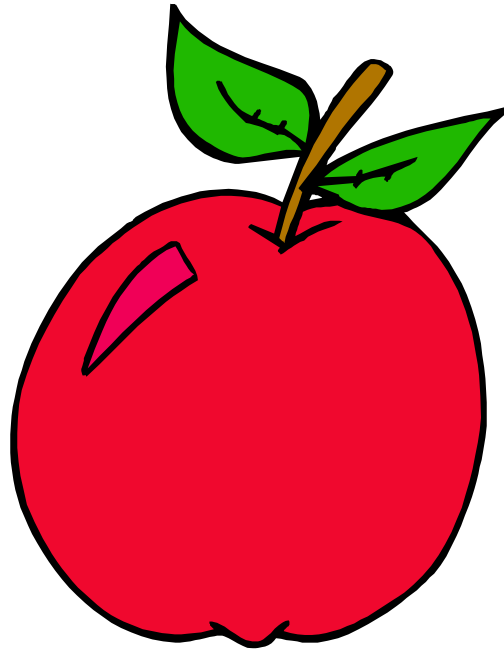
