Thank you for downloading! This resource includes the instructions, examples, and pages necessary for you and your students to create a Spring flipbook. The flip book is how to/procedural for the topic – 'How to Grow a Flower'. The flipbook includes instructional pages with examples of what the it will look like. The flipbook also comes in two versions (dotted and plain lines), to suit multiple year levels. Enjoy!

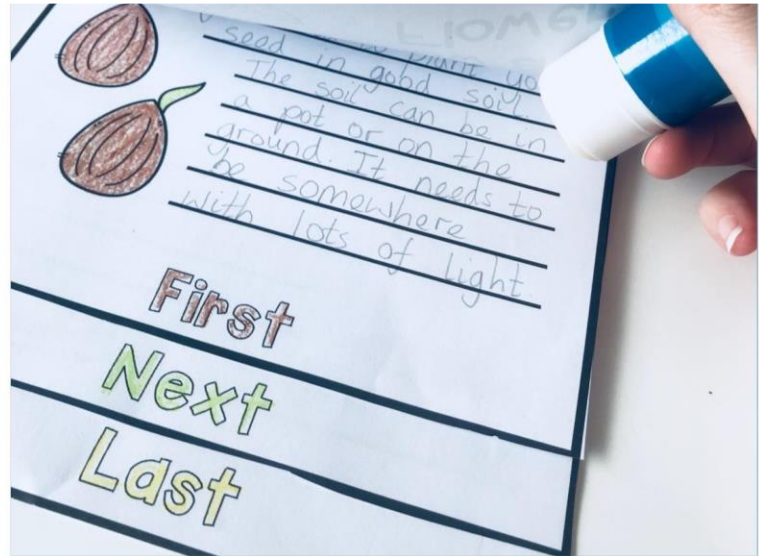
What it will look like...



Teacher Instructions:

- 1.) Print the flip book pages.
- 2.) Students color the pictures and write in each section.
- 3.) Students cut out each box (each box is labelled on the left as Page 1, 2, 3, or 4).
- 4.) Assist students to glue the flipbook together. They glue the pages on top of each other. They add glue where it says 'glue here' on each page. The smallest page (Page 1) is the title page which goes on top. Pages 2 and 3 go below. The largest page (Page 4) is at the bottom of the pile.

4 Easy Steps

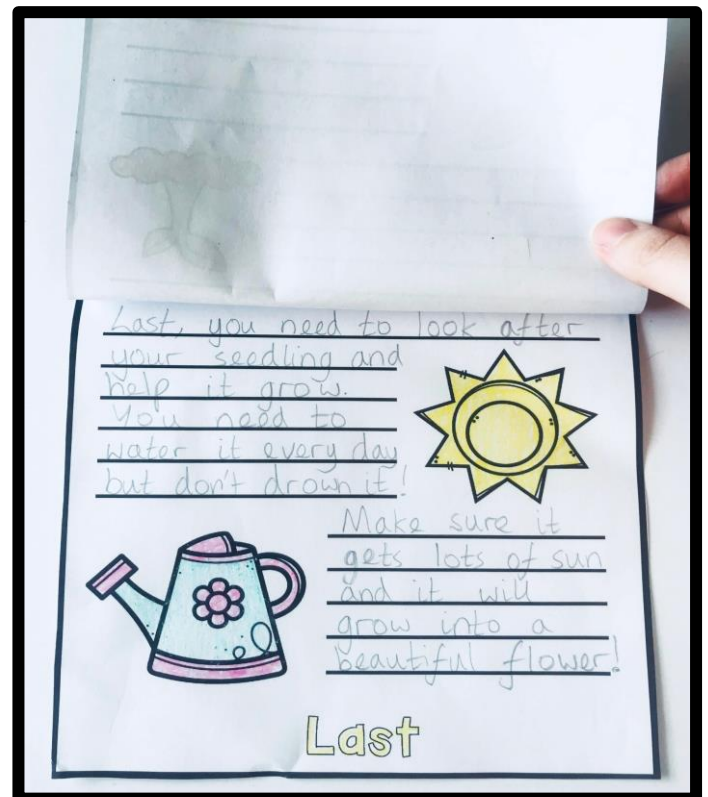
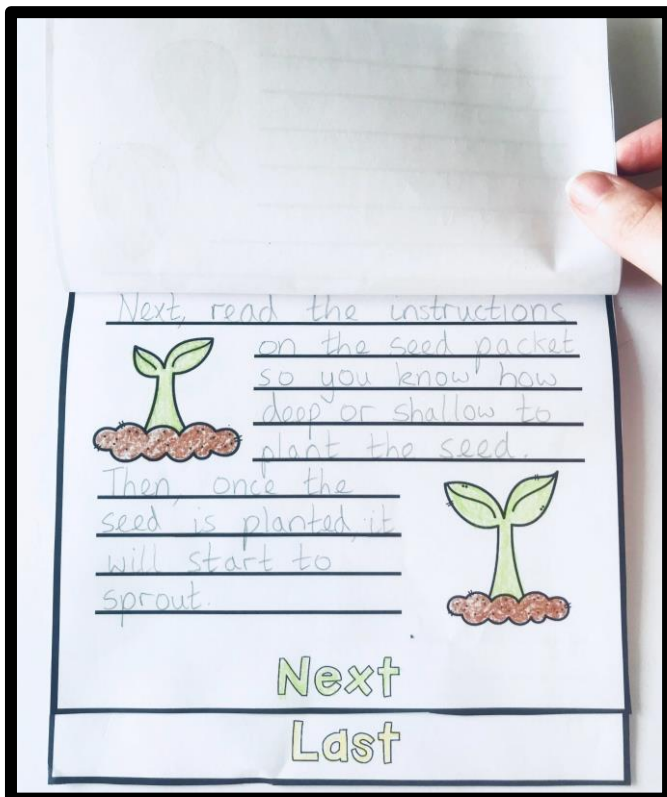
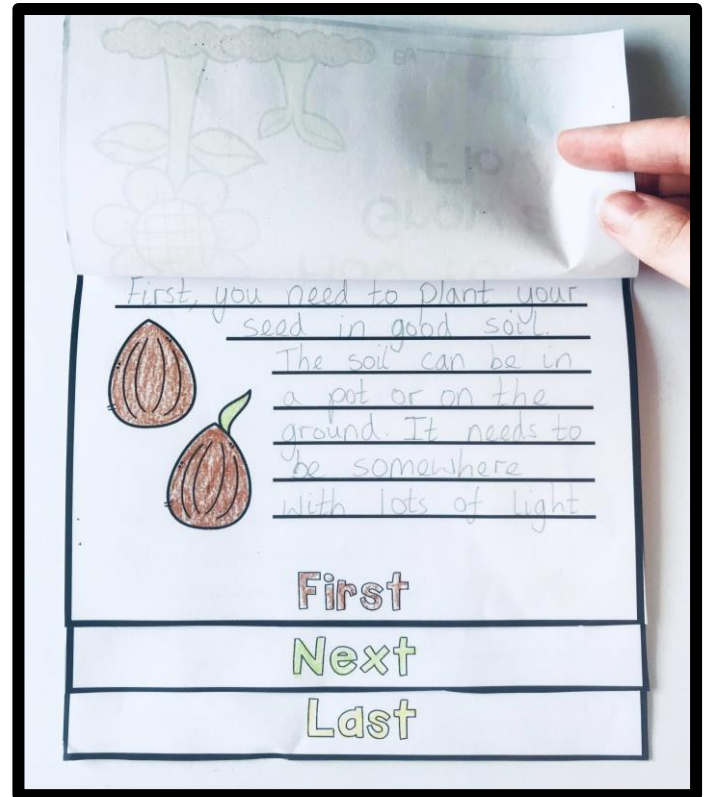
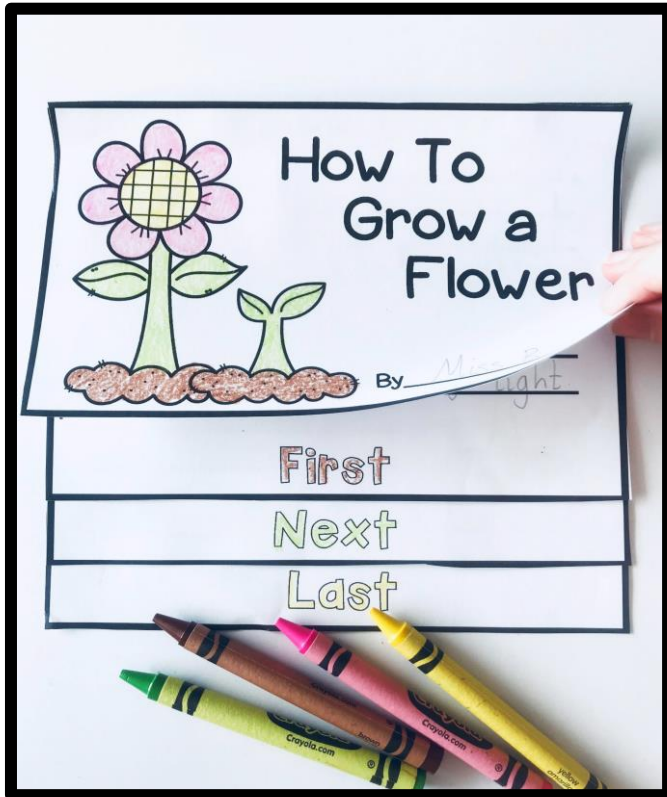


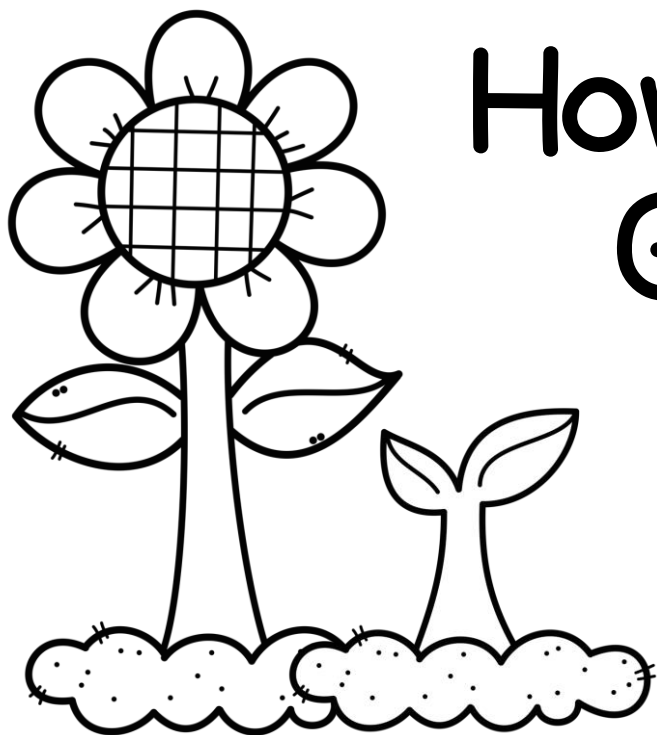
Color, write, cut, and Glue!

- 1.) write on the lines.
- 2.) Color in the pictures.
- 3.) Cut out the boxes.
- 4.) Glue the four boxes on top of each other where it says 'glue here'. The largest box (page 4) goes on the bottom. The smallest box (title page 1) goes on the top of the pile.
