






Forest Schools

Attendance and Punctuality



Our School Attendance Policy

Your child must attend school regularly and punctually each day.

Receiving a full-time, suitable education is a child's legal entitlement, and it is the parent/carer's legal responsibility to ensure this. Please refer to our schools attendance policy on the school website.

By law all children of compulsory school age must receive a full-time education. Attendance is just as important as any curricular subject as your child can not learn and achieve if they are not in school.

If my child is too unwell to come to school.

<u>Step 1</u>: Every parent must contact the school by 9:00am and report their child's absence via our **Studybugs** app or by telephone.

<u>Step 2</u>: If your child is absent from school then medical evidence **must** be provided to authorise these absences. <u>Please note that handwritten letters will not authorise absence.</u>

Medical evidence we will accept:

- 1. A prescription/prescribed medication with your child's name on the box/bottle
- 2. Doctor/Medical Notes (if provided)
- 3. Hospital/discharge letter


A national framework was introduced on the 19th August in regards to how Penalty Notices are issued. We will be sending out further information via studybugs. It is important that you stay informed. IV



Learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage

Children in the EYFS learn by playing and exploring, being active, and through creative and critical thinking which takes place both indoors and outside.

We aim to provide an environment that is stimulating and exciting. We firmly believe children learn best through play. We ensure that children get a good balance of activities, using the Foundation Stage Curriculum.

There are seven areas of learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum:



Personal, Social & Emotional Development



Personal, social and emotional development involves helping children to develop a positive sense of themselves, and others; to form positive relationships and develop respect for others; to develop social skills and learn how to manage their feelings; to understand appropriate behaviour in groups; and to have confidence in their own abilities.













Communication and Language

Communication and language development involves giving children opportunities to experience a rich language environment; to develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves; and to speak and listen in a range of situations.







Physical Development

Physical development involves providing opportunities for young children to be active and interactive; and to develop their co-ordination, control, and movement. Children are also helped to understand the importance of physical activity, and to make healthy choices in relation to food.















Literacy

Literacy development involves encouraging children to link sounds and letters and to begin to read and write. Children are given access to a wide range of reading materials (books, poems, and other written materials) to ignite their interest.













Mathematics

Mathematics involves providing children with opportunities to develop and improve their skills in counting, understanding and using numbers, calculating simple addition and subtraction problems; and to describe shapes, spaces, and measures.












Understanding of the World

Understanding the world involves guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community through opportunities to explore, observe and find out about people, places, technology and the environment.











Expressive Arts and Design

Expressive arts and design involves enabling children to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials, as well as providing opportunities and encouragement for sharing their thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance, role-play, and design and technology.











Phonics

- •The school follows the Read Write Inc. scheme to teach Phonics. The children will learn Set 1 and Set 2 Sounds in Reception.
- •During Phonics the children will be learning to blend and read green words. The children will also learn to read high frequency words such I, the and said.
- •Once your children learn the first few sounds they'll start to read Red Ditty Books. It's very important to read with your child everyday at home.


We will have a phonics workshop, please look out for the date in the newsletter.





Reading

- •Every Monday the children will swap their level book (Spring Term) and Love of reading book. Please ensure your child comes with their reading books on that day so they can be exchanged for new ones.
- •We also strongly encourage parents to complete a book review to help your child to understand the story by asking them questions such as what was their favourite part.





How can you help with your child's learning?



- All homework will be on Google Classrooms on Fridays from Autumn
 2.
- Reading regularly with your child (you reading to them + listening to them read).
- Practise their sounds with them not just the letter names.
- Practise writing their name and CVC words e.g cat, black, hat.
- Encourage counting and recognising numbers to 20.
- Role play matching quantity to numerals.
