Abstract Nouns

An abstract noun is something that exists but can't physically be touched. Examples:

love bravery sorrow
opinion strength
beauty luck trust
fear joy success

Pronoun

Pronouns identify something in a general way, so one is used at many different objects or people.

Collective Nouns

A collective noun is a name given to a group of one type of something specific, often people or animals. In a lot of cases the pronoun will have an obvious connection to the group it is given to for example 'army of ants' refers to a large amount of well organised and ruthless ants. Examples:

A herd of giraffes
A gaggle of geese

Common

Common nouns are just in the way that you can find them. A common noun is 'building' is a common noun. These are all types of buildings. Examples:

vegetable
clothes chair

Common Nouns

Something in a very general sense. One pronoun could be used many different times for different things or people. Examples:

she they

you we

Countable Nouns

Just like concrete nouns, you can physically touch them. A countable noun is a general term. For example, 'bridge' is a general term that could refer to many different types of buildings. Examples:

leopard animal
chocolate

Concrete Nouns

You can experience concrete nouns with your five senses: you see them, hear them, smell them, taste them, and feel them. Examples:

bottle car
hammer magnet
table ball



Proper Nouns

Following on from common nouns, a proper noun is a specific noun. For example, 'Where' is a common noun, 'Golden Delicious Apple' is a proper noun as it refers to a specific apple. Examples:

Paris
The Eiffel Tower
South Yorkshire Police
