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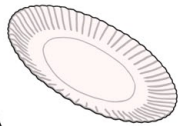
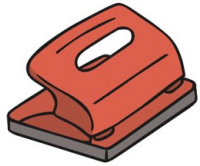


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Spring Craft Instructions

Butterfly Hand Prints

You will need...



Plates or trays for paint

Paint brushes

White or black card

Several different colours of paint

Pipe cleaners cut in to quarters

Scissors

A hole punch



1.



Support the child to cover their left hand with blobs of paint; using several different colours.

What you do...

2.

Print the child's hand onto the right side of the card. Do this with the thumb facing the edge and the little finger running close to the centre of the page running vertical.



3.



Fold the card in half making sure that the edges match up before you press it down, then open up and leave to dry.

4.

Once dry either cut out around the hand print, or leave it as it is. Then hole punch at the top between the little finger prints.



5.



Thread through the pipe cleaner and twist it at the top to create the antenna.
