## YEAR 3 - Week Beginning 8.6.20

- Our spelling learning this week is looking at words ending with the /zhuh/ sound spelt 'sure'. Use the look, cover and write sheet to practise and then test yourself with the word search.
- This week for grammar we are focusing on fronted adverbials use the worksheet to practise identifying the adverbial, then rewrite the sentence by moving the adverbial to the front.
- Describe a special place you have been to. Include expanded noun phrases to help you, using the 'powerful three adjectives' technique where you can, e.g. the wild, savage and blood-thirsty tiger.

- Once you've finished your description, have a go at drawing it. Make sure it matches how you've described it!



- We are going to recap some of our basic maths skills. This week, we are looking at column subtraction.
- Go over how to do column subtraction and answer the questions on the worksheet.
- Don't forget to use you Times Tables Rockstars login to practice your Times Tables (3,4,6,8)



- This week we're still looking at animals and how they adapt to their environment.
- Design an animal for the jungle/desert based on climate/vegetation/location criteria.
- Include as much detail as possible, such as its fur, eyes, ears, teeth, claws/paws, diet, etc.
- Extra points for really creative animals!
