Aims and Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● To create inclusive and sustainable opportunities for pupils and young people to actively engage in music making, both curricular and cross-curricular ● To foster participation, progression, and personal development through music. ● To cultivate a diverse, and enduring music education framework within the school. ● To ensure all pupils with SEND participate fully in music education.
1 - Key components	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All pupils will participate in weekly music lessons using the Charanga music scheme, ensuring national curriculum coverage as well as engaging with a wide variety of music styles and genres. ● Provide lessons with a specialist music teacher to teach the pupils in Key Stage 2 to have whole class instrumental lessons on the guitar and ukulele. ● Singing lessons held throughout the school by the music specialist where pupils engage with a wide variety of different musical styles appropriate to age.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Provide opportunities for pupils to participate in additional enrichment throughout the academic year, including after school provision led by the music specialist and the music lead. ● All pupils will attend weekly singing assemblies provided by both the music lead and music specialist, singing a wide variety of songs and developing relevant music skills ● All pupils will have the opportunity to perform in school during the academic year in order to showcase their learning in music. This includes celebration assemblies, instrumental performances and the choir.
2 - Focus areas for 2024-25	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Pupils across Key Stage 2 will continue to access specialist teaching of instrumental learning in guitar and ukulele. This will enable the pupils who to continue to develop the basic musical skills they have already developed and will allow new pupils to begin this musical journey. By using a high-qualified and experienced musician as the teacher, this delivery will be able to be adapted in order to support or challenge the pupils depending on what level they are at. As the specialist teacher is delivering the instrumental sessions across KS2, he is able to effectively support pupils to develop musicianship. ● Pupils across the school to continue with Charanga music scheme developing singing, musical vocabulary and listening/ evaluating skills appropriate to their age group ● After school clubs such as choir and music club will give pupils the opportunity to develop skills further as well as making use of and exploring a wide variety of musical instruments. ● Music lead will take advantage of visiting artists scheme to provide a music workshop and performing day by a visiting music group.
3 – Curricular and Cross-Curricular Music provision for 2024-25	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Through appointing a full-time musician to work across 3 schools in our MAT, the pupils at North Beckton will have 2 days of musical tuition per week. This will mean that classes in KS2 will have whole class instrumental lessons. Alongside this, pupils will be able to attend a weekly after choir session and a weekly music club. ● Pupils across the school also have music lessons led by the class teacher using the Charanga music scheme ● Pupils in year 4 will participate in a workshop day and performance from a visiting world music group

4 – Expected outputs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 6 classes x 30 pupils for instrumental lessons (3x half terms per year): 90 pupils ● 16 teachers supported in delivering their music lessons ● After school choir: potential 20 children ● After school instrumental sessions : potential 12-20 children ● Singing assemblies- whole school
5 – Inclusion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All pupils will have access to Charanga lessons, all pupils will have access to Instrumental lessons, including the pupils with additional SEN needs. SEND pupils will also attend sensory music sessions. SEND pupils who have a flair for/interest in music will be included in the after school clubs. All pupils will have access to weekly singing assemblies including those with SEND. All pupils will participate in performances and celebration assemblies, including those with SEND. PMLD class will have music lessons and daily interaction with music and song led by the music specialist
6 – Resources	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The school has a large number of different musical instruments – drums, guitars, keyboards, ukekeles, glockenspiels, flute and violin, hand percussion etc- all are used regularly either in specialist instrumental lessons or in after school clubs. ● We will be working in partnership with Curwen Primary School and Ranelagh Primary School.
7 – Evaluation	<p>We will -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Collect feedback from pupils and staff ● Monitor and assess the progress of students participating in curriculum music and supported instrumental lessons to track their musical development. ● Keep records of the number of students involved in extra-curricular music provision within the school. ● Schedule termly curriculum review to assess how the curriculum coverage and standards are. ● Schedule performances, assemblies, and showcases where students can present their musical learning to the school community and families
