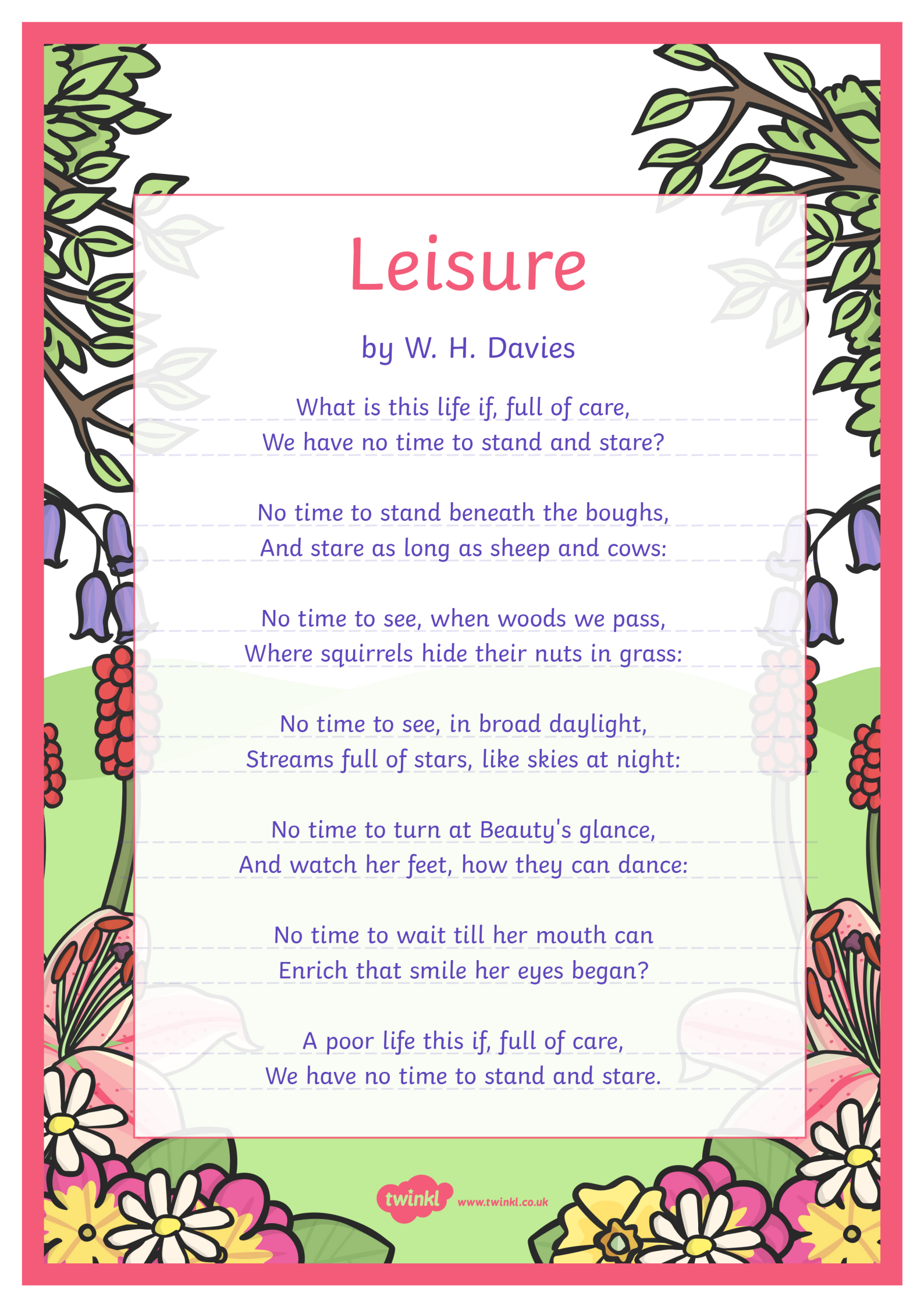




Leisure

And stare as long as sheep and cows:

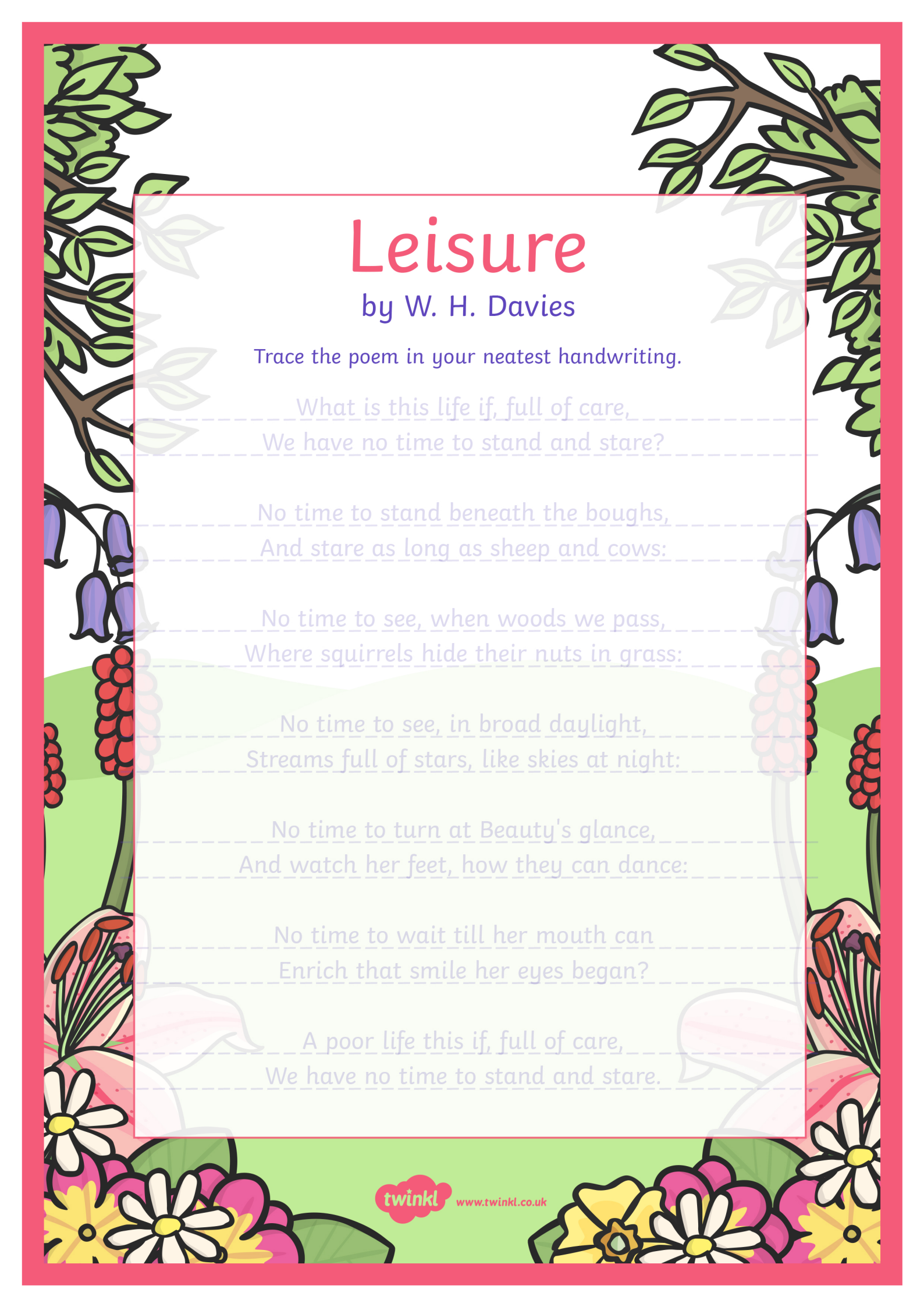
No time to see, when woods we pass,
