

I walked home.

Statements are usually
subject- verb.

They end with a full
stop.

Say a statement.



Questions



Can I have chips please?

A question is verb-subject in order.

It will finish with a question mark.



Ask a question.

Exclamations




What a lovely day!

An exclamation will start with how or what.

It will end with an exclamation mark.

Say an exclamation sentence.



Commands

Get out!

They can end with a full stop or exclamation mark depending on the tone of the sentence.

Pass me your book.

A command is often verb- subject.

Statements - Statements are sentences that tell you something. They end with a full stop.

Questions - Questions are sentences that ask you something. They usually end with a question mark.

Commands - Commands are sentences that tell you to do something. They are often urgent or angry and can be very short.

Exclamations - Exclamations are sentences that begin with 'what' or 'how'. They are full sentences, include a verb and end with an exclamation mark.
