These words all sound the same, but they are spelt differently, and have different meanings.




there

'there' refers to a place or position.

The children are playing over <u>there</u>.



<u>There</u> is an aeroplane in the sky.



their

'their' is a possessive adjective. This means it shows ownership or belonging.

<u>Their</u> lunch was very tasty.



The children are wearing <u>their</u> school uniform.




they're

'they're' is a contraction. This means it is a shorter way of saying 'they are'.

<u>They're</u> playing a game together.



<u>They're</u> running around the track.



there, their and they're

<u>They're</u> all talking to <u>their</u> friends over <u>there</u>.
