Grammar - for grammar, we'd like you to revise modal verbs. These are verbs that indicate the possibility or certainty of something happening.

History: Learn about Pocahontas and Jamestown by using the PowerPoint. After looking at the PowerPoint, write a diary entry from the perspective of Pocahontas that explains how you find England.

Computing: This week, we're going to be using Google Earth to help us create our own map of the area in which we live.

Art: Now it's time to complete your artwork and consider what went well and how you might approach a similar task next time.
