



Recipe: Boiled Eggs (stove)



- Place eggs* in a large pot.
*single layer
- Add water to cover eggs by one inch.
- Put pot on stove and turn to high heat.
- When the water starts to boil, cover pot with lid.
- Turn off the heat and wait 10 minutes.
- Spoon eggs into ice water and wait 10 more minutes. Now they are done!

How to: Dye Eggs with rice



- Fill a container with 1/4 cup of dry rice. (use a small container with a lid or ziplock bag)
- Add 5-10 drops of food coloring.
- Add egg.
- Close container/bag and shake!
- Take the egg out and set aside to dry.
- Repeat steps for each color.

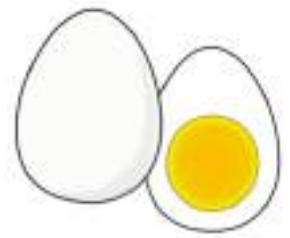

Recipe: Boiled Eggs



(Instant Pot / pressure cooker)

1. Put wire rack in bottom of the pot.



2. Add 1 cup of water.



3. Place eggs* on the rack.

*single layer



4. Lock lid and turn vent to "sealing".

5. Cook on manual for 5 minutes.



6*. Carefully switch vent to "venting" to release steam. *adult



7. Spoon eggs into ice water and wait 10 minutes. Now they are done!

Recipe: Jell-O Eggs



1. Spray the inside of mold with cooking spray.



2. Snap egg mold together.



3. Pour 1 and $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of water into a bowl.



4. Microwave water for 3 minutes.



5. Add 6 ounces of Jell-O and stir for 3 minutes.



6. Pour into the molds and chill overnight or at least three hours.



7. Run the mold under warm water and then carefully open to release the eggs.

Recipe Sequencing: Cut and Glue pictures and directions in order.

Jell-O Eggs



Snap egg mold together.



Microwave water for 3 minutes.



Add 6 ounces of Jell-O and stir for 3 minutes.



Spray the inside of mold with cooking spray.



Pour into the molds and chill overnight or at least three hours.



Pour 1 and 1/2 cups of water into a bowl.



Run the mold under warm water and then carefully open to release the eggs.

Recipe: Deviled Eggs



1. Peel 6 boiled eggs.



7. Add 1 teaspoon mustard.



2. Slice the eggs in half.



8. Add 1/8 teaspoon of salt.



3. Scoop out the yolks and place in the bowl.



9. Add 1/8 teaspoon of pepper.



4. Mash the yolks.



10. Mix well.



5. Add 1/4 cup Mayonnaise to the bowl.



11. Scoop mixture back into eggs.



6. Add 1 teaspoon vinegar.



12. Sprinkle paprika on top (optional)

Options: Before you Dye your Eggs

(choose one option for each egg)



A. Wrap a rubber band around your egg.



B. Color your egg with a crayon.



C. Put a sticker on your egg.



D. Use tape to make lines on your egg.

E. Do nothing and dye your egg as is!

(You will remove A, C and D after dyeing!)

How to: Dye Eggs



1. Fill cup with enough water to cover an egg.



2. Add 1 teaspoon of white vinegar.



3. Add about 20 drops of food coloring.
(or tablet from an egg dye kit)



4. Repeats steps 1-3 for each color.



5. Place egg in dye and wait until you like the color.



6. Use a spoon to take the egg out and set aside to dry.

How to: Dye Eggs with rice



1. Fill a container with $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of dry rice. (use a small container with a lid or ziplock bag)



2. Add 5-10 drops of food coloring.



3. Add egg.



4. Close container/bag and shake!

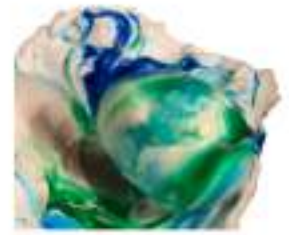


5. Take the egg out and set aside to dry.



6. Repeat steps for each color.

How to: Dye Eggs with cream



1. Spread cream in a baking dish about 1 inch thick.

(shaving cream = non edible or whipped cream = edible)



2. Add drops of food coloring on cream.



3. Use a toothpick to swirl the food coloring.



4. Roll egg on the cream.



5. Take the egg out and dry for 30 minutes. Leave cream on the egg!



6. Rinse eggs with cold water.

Recipe Sequencing: Cut and Glue pictures and directions in order.

Dying Eggs



Fill cup with enough water to cover an egg.



Add about 20 drops of food coloring.



Add 1 teaspoon of white vinegar.



Place egg in dye and wait until you like the color.



Use a spoon to take the egg out and set aside to dry.



Repeats steps 1-3 for each color.

Recipe Sequencing: Cut and Glue pictures and directions in order.

Dying Eggs: Rice



Close container/bag and shake!



Add egg.



Add 5-10 drops of food coloring.



Take the egg out and set aside to dry.



Repeat steps for each color.



Fill a container with $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of dry rice.

Dying Eggs: Cream



Spread cream in a baking dish about 1 inch thick.



Take the egg out and dry for 30 minutes. Leave cream on the egg!



Use a toothpick to swirl the food coloring.



Add drops of food coloring on cream.



Roll egg on the cream.



Rinse eggs with cold water.
