






Geographical Locations and Characteristics

vegetation and land use.




Climate Zones

The system describes five main climate groups and each of

climate groups and each of these groups consist of a range of climate types.

(Note that climate zones relate to latitude but there are other factors such as ocean currents, winds and land masses that also influence climate groups and types.)

Biomes

The climate and geography of an area also determines its type of **biome**.

The world can be divided up into different major biome sites.

You can find out more about biomes by looking at the 'World Biomes' PowerPoint in the folder.

A biome is a large geographical area which is home to certain plants and animals, specially adapted to suit the environment.
