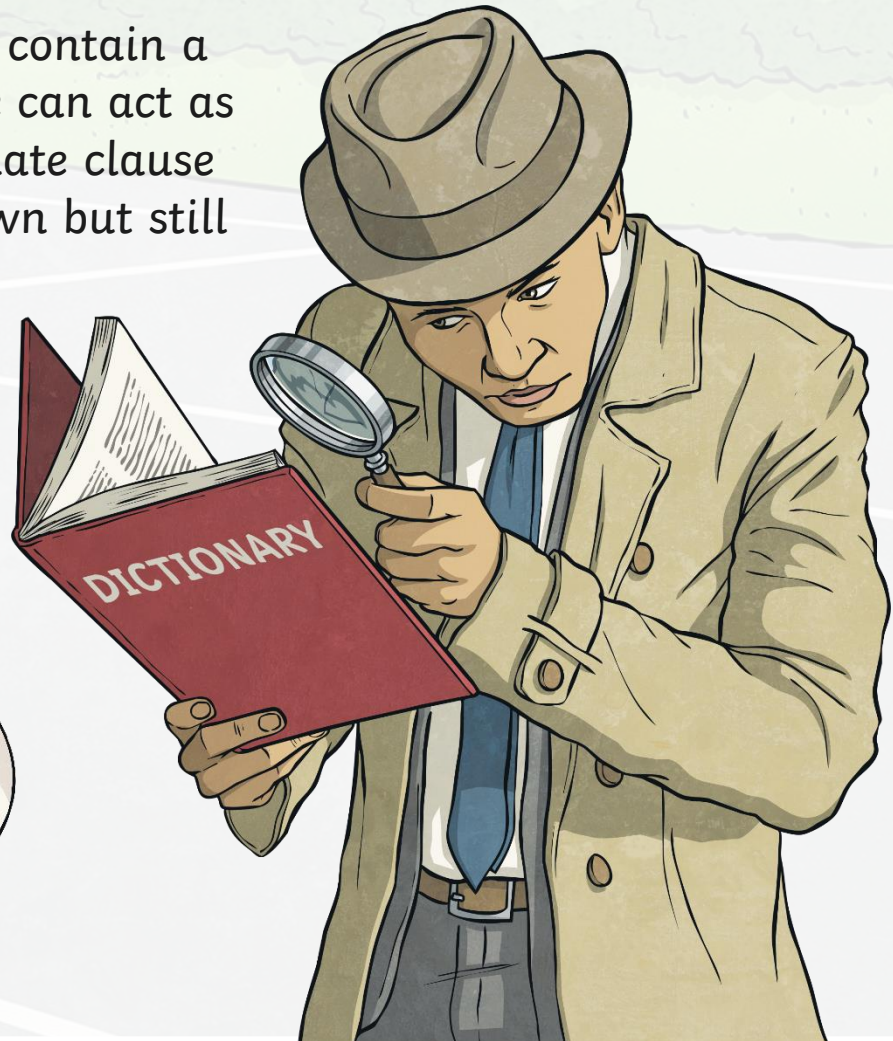

What are phrases and clauses?

A clause is a group of words that contain a subject and a verb. A main clause can act as a sentence on its own. A subordinate clause cannot act as a sentence on its own but still contains a subject and a verb.
