

Nursery- Week Beginning 20.4.2020

Whilst children are off and keeping safe at home we recommend children continue to complete activities set by school. We hope this will ensure some continuity in children's learning and development. Each week a homework project will be published on the school website under the designated area labelled **Our Learning/ Learning at Home/EYFS**. This will contain a range of activities under the main areas of learning for children to complete throughout the week.

Please can you record children's homework in the yellow books provided where possible. The yellow books will need to be returned to school when school re-opens.

Advised Timetable:

- Read a story everyday.
- Practise writing your name everyday.
- Complete a phonics and numeracy activity everyday.
- Complete at least 1 activity from other areas each day.
- Take part in rhyme time everyday.

Mark Making

- Can you practise writing your full name?
- Can you draw a picture of everyone in your family (Family tree)? (focus on a detailed drawing of a person)

Phonics

- Can you read Julia Donaldson stories and explore rhyming words?
- Can you play I 'Spy with a set of objects and say the initial sound in words?

Project

What can you see out of your window?

Ask your child to look out of a window in the house and draw what they can see. Look out of a different windows (e.g. back or side of the house). Look at the two pictures together and discuss what is the same in both pictures (e.g. the sky) and what is different.

Record how many cars/ people walk past your house?

Set a timer for 5 minutes on your phone or tablet. Draw out a simple grid and ask your child to put a tick in the right place every time a person or car goes past. When complete, can they count up the ticks and write the matching numeral? Were there more people or cars?

Numeracy

- Can you orally count 0-10 forwards, backwards and irregularly?
- Can you practise making amounts up to 9 in as many different ways as possible?
- Can you order number 0-9?

Skills- Can you learn to make your bed and tidy your bedroom? **Rhyme Time-** Polly put the kettle on
