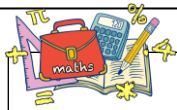




YEAR 3 - Week Beginning 11.5.20

- Our spelling learning this week is looking at - words that belong to the 'struct' and 'uni' families. Use the look, cover and write sheet to practise and then test yourself with the word search.
- This week for grammar we are focusing on conjunctions to join two sentences or clauses together, use the game to practise then write your own sentences with a conjunction. Cover the conjunctions over and test a sibling or adult!

- We are going to focus on creating your own nonsense poem, use the instructions to learn how to create your first draft

- Once you have written your draft write your poem up in neat and use drawings to create a boarder.



- We are recapping what we already know about telling time - use what you already know to complete the converting time worksheet and play the board game. Finished? Try the challenge questions!
- Use your workbook to keep a diary of you day, write down the time (digitally and on an analogue clock if you can) of thing you do in the day such as when you get up, when you eat lunch and go to sleep
- Don't forget to use you Times Tables Rockstars login to practice your Times Tables (3,4,6,8)

- Use your garden or a local park to become an explorer and try to find a plant at each stage of the cycle. Pick up any seeds you find on the floor and take them home to watch them grow!
- Use your workbook to record what you have found in the format of a flipbook. Fold a page of your book in half towards the margin and cut a flap for each stage of the cycle with a description, drawing or photo underneath.
