



YEAR 3 - Week Beginning 27.4.20

- Our spelling learning this week is looking at - words with a 'u' sound that are spelt with a 'o'. Use the look, cover and write sheet to practise and then test yourself with the word search.
- This week for grammar we are focusing on apostrophe's for contraction - use the worksheet to practise and create your own conversation.
- Choose one of the pictures to inspire your own story or use the link to find one of your own.

- First you must use the storyboard template to plan your ideas and create a beginning, middle and end. Remember you only need to use bullet points and pictures to record your ideas!
- Once you have planned your story you can start to write it - use the pages of your book to write your first draft, don't forget to leave a line so you can read it through and edit it against the checklist once you have finished.



- We are beginning to look at measurement involving capacity and volume - find 4 different sized containers that hold water (for example a cup, bowl, eggcup and bucket). Use these to complete the investigations and record your findings in your book. Try and do this outside to save on mess!
- Don't forget to use you Times Tables Rockstars login to practice your Times Tables (3,4,6,8)



- This week we'll be focusing more on the specific parts of plants and their functions. Use the information to draw and label a diagram that explains how water travels through a plant. Try to include key vocabulary in your written explanation.
- Then put your knowledge to the test by trying one or both of the experiments that replicate the process, either take pictures or draw diagrams to record your experiences.



RE: Use the information from the website to create a poster that shows the story of Passover and each of the 10 plagues. Underneath explain using a diagram how the celebrate and describe the meaning of each item on the Sedar plate.
