- Our spelling learning this week was looking at words with a 'sh' sound that are spelt with a 'ch'.
 Use the look, cover and write sheet to practise and then test yourself with the word search.
 Underneath write the meaning of each word and put it in a silly sentence.
- Now we have finished 'Fortunately, the Milk' use the template to create a book review and gather
 your ideas and thoughts.
- Put these into a written letter to the author Neil Gaiman to describe to him your favourite and least favourite parts of the book, the character you enjoyed the most, any questions you have and whether you think Dad's story was real or fiction.



- We have been looking measurement and units of measure in maths. Using your knowledge, work out the length, volume and weight from the ruler, jug and scales on the worksheet.
- Don't forget to practice your Times Tables (3,4,6,8 in that order)

DT: Use a blank piece of paper to create questions and collect feedback about what people thought about your sandwich. Underneath write a paragraph explaining what you would keep the same and what you would change and improve.
