YEAR 3 - Week Beginning 20.4.20

- Our spelling learning this week is looking at words ending with '-ary', such as 'dictionary'. Use the look, cover and write sheet to practise and then test yourself with the word search.
- This week for grammar we are focusing on apostrophes for possession use the worksheet to practise and come up with some of your own sentences including apostrophes for possession.
- Think about how much your life has changed during the lockdown. Write a diary about life at home. Talk
 about the activities you did, what you enjoy about them and things that you miss doing outside or at
 school.

- This week we'll be focusing on what makes a plant grow healthily, especially in relation to photosynthesis. Use the information to draw and label a diagram that explains how photosynthesis occurs in a plant. Try to include key vocabulary in your written explanation.
- Then put your knowledge to the test by trying the experiments that replicate the process, either take pictures or draw diagrams to record your experiences.



RE: Use the information from the website to create an illustrated mind map about Judaism and what Jews believe. On another page, create a storyboard on how Jews celebrate the Sabbath.
