FROM PUBLIC HEALTH ENGLAND TO PARENTS

You should only book a test if your child has any of these 3 coronavirus symptoms:

- 1) a high temperature: any new high temperature where your child feels hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature)
- 2) a new continuous cough: coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- 3) a loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste: a noticeable loss of smell or taste or things smell and taste different to normal.

One of our community contacts has recommended sharing information with you all about a new project from Newham College for people aged 19+ to get in to employment in health care www.getintohealthcare.co.uk


It has been designed to provide unemployed people with the skills, awareness and knowledge to help them find work within a wide range of career areas in the health and care sector, whether in direct care related roles such as patient care, caring for the elderly or in associated job areas such as customer service, reception, administration, finance, hospitality, cleaning, portering, patient transport and so on.

The courses are aimed at people from all levels of learning who are looking for jobs within the health and care sector and will provide learners with a tailored route into their chosen career area, and involve online and face to face learning, job search support and employer engagement throughout. We are working closely with a range of employers, including Barts NHS in offering real employment opportunities for those taking part.

To be eligible for the free courses, learners need to be unemployed, aged 19+ and live within one of the following boroughs:
