There are many different charities offering support to children and families around bereavement, these listed here offer more appropriate information that is geared around schools as well as children and families.

They offer a range of resources and support options for children and their families including:

- Freephone National Helpline is free to call on 08088 020 021 which offers therapeutic advice following a bereavement. The helpline provides bereavement support for parents, carers and professionals who are looking for childhood bereavement advice and support.
- Online chat support designed to help children and young people talk about their grief and discuss ways to manage this via one to one support speaking to someone.
- ASK email service is a UK-wide national email service, offering support, information and advice to anyone seeking it.
