

## PE Grant Money 2015-16

For the academic year September 2015 to July 2016 North Beckton Primary School has been given £10,035. We received £5854 in October and in April 2016 we will receive an additional funding of £4181. The information below explains how the funding will be used at North Beckton:

- Provide a specialist coach to teach 1 lesson of PE a week for all classes from Reception up to Year 6 to improve the skills of mainstream pupils and those with Special Educational needs.
- To run intra school sports competitions between team colour groups to enable more pupils to have the opportunity to take part in competitive sport.
- Provide professional development opportunities for teachers and support staff, enabling quality teaching and learning for all pupils.
- In January, provide training for support staff to gain ideas to support pupils in physical activities during break time and lunchtimes.

## Effect on PE of the PE Grant Money 2015-16

North Beckton Primary school received £10,035 allocated by the department of education designed and intended to improve the impact the school has on:

- Pupils' PE and sport participation.
- Attainment in PE.
- All pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

North Beckton used the money to employ a sports coach to support the school in teaching PE.

The information below outlines the outcome of the Grant spending in the different areas:

- Having a qualified sports coach supporting teachers to plan and teach the outdoor PE lesson for pupils in Reception to Year 6, has increased the challenge to and engagement of pupils during these lessons.
- Having the support of a qualified sports coach has enabled teachers, who were team teaching with him, to develop their subject knowledge in PE and feel more confident in teaching the skills needed in lessons.

Pupils are therefore receiving the teaching of skills they need to develop in PE.

- Having a qualified sports coach teaching the majority of outdoor PE lessons has also had a positive effect on pupil's engagement and feeling of challenge in lessons.
- The sports coach has provided sports afterschool clubs and training sessions for school sports teams thus helping pupils to develop healthy life styles. The clubs and training sessions have been for cricket, football, athletics and basketball.
- More pupils are participating in competitive sports competitions.
- After the INSET for support staff, lunchtime staff are encouraging and supporting pupils to engage in physical activities during break time and lunchtimes.
- Overall the grant has allowed pupils to look at sport positively and given pupils in North Beckton Primary School more opportunities to be more active therefore healthier. Also it has again enabled North Beckton Primary School to achieve a Sainsbury's Bronze Games Mark.

#### PE Grant Money 2014-15

For the academic year September 2014 to July 2015, North Beckton Primary School has received £5758 in October. In April 2014, we will receive an additional funding of £4112 to be used in the academic year Sept 2014 to July 2015. The information below explains how the funding will be used at North Beckton:

- Encourage all children to participate in PE through weekly class PE kit competitions in Reception, Key stage 1 And Key stage 2.
- Provide resources and equipment to allow children with Special Education Needs to access PE lessons and have opportunities for physical development.
- Provide professional development opportunities for teachers, enabling quality teaching and learning for all children.
- Provide specialist coaches to teach 1 lesson of PE a week for all classes from year 1 up to year 6 to improve the skills of mainstream and children with Special Educational needs.
- To run intra sports competitions between team colour groups to enable more children to have the opportunity to take part in competitive sport.
- Participate in inter school competitions run by Langdon Academy to allow Gifted and Talented children to take part in competitive sport.

- Provide resources to be used in PE lessons, sports competitions and after school clubs to develop children's skills and interest in sport.
- Provide awards to celebrate the achievement and sportsmanship during all competitions and sports days and raise the profile of sport within the school.
- Find and provide opportunities to see live sports.

Overall we aim to improve the quality of PE lessons with the appropriate equipment and to raise standards in PE by increasing children's enjoyment, participation and opportunities with both in PE and competitive sport.

### Effect on PE of the PE Grant Money 2014 - 15

North Beckton Primary school received £9870 allocated by the department of education designed and intended to improve the impact the school has on:

- Pupils' PE and sport participation.
- Attainment in PE.
- All pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

The PE and Sports Grant has given North Beckton Primary School the opportunity to again link with the Langdon School Sports Partnership which gives our pupils the opportunity to compete in inter-school competitions Borough and London wide. It also gives our teaching staff the opportunity to participate in PE training days to further improve the quality of their teaching in PE and Sport at North Beckton Primary School. In addition North Beckton used the money to employ a sports coach to plan and teach 1 lesson of PE per week for each week from year 1 to year 6.

The information below outlines the outcome of the Grant spending in the different areas:

- Having a qualified sports coach plan and teach the outdoor PE lesson for pupils in Year 1 to Year 6, has increased the challenge to and engagement of children during these lessons.
- Alongside the PE kit weekly award, the enjoyment displayed in the lessons taught by the sports coach have encouraged more pupils' involvement in PE, as more pupils are bringing in their full PE kits.

- With support from the sports coach, pupils from Year 1 to Year 6 have been able to develop skills in a variety of sports and physical activities.
- Having a qualified coach planning and teaching PE has given teachers the opportunity for CPD. They have improved their PE skills and knowledge by observing different aspects of PE being delivered in varying ways. This gave teachers more confidence in teaching PE and a specialist to ask for advice when needed.
- Pupils with SEN have continued to use the specialist PE equipment to help with their physical development and participation in PE lessons.
- Gifted and Talented pupils from Years 1 to 6 again participated in 1 or more inter-school competitions organised by the Langdon Sports Partnership. They enjoyed playing in a competitive environment and developing their skills against other schools in a variety of sports. There has been an increase in the number of pupils volunteering to compete in these competitive competitions.
- Again the intra-team colour sports competitions were run over 2 terms involving 2 different sports. It allowed pupils from Year 1 to Year 6 to compete in a competitive environment. The pupils enjoyed competing against each other and strived to make their colour team the overall winner. The competitions were run by a team of 10 year 5 sport leaders. This allowed the leaders to develop their organisational and communication skills.
- Awards are given out during Early Years and KS1 sports day, KS2 sports day, Year 5 and year 6 athletic finals to promote competitiveness and celebrate ability and success.

#### PE Grant Money 2013-14

For the academic year September 2013 to July 2014, North Beckton Primary School has received £6001. In April 2014, we will receive an additional funding of £3,279 to be used in the academic year Sept 2014 to July 2015. The information below explains how the funding will be used at North Beckton:

- Encourage all children to participate in PE through weekly class PE kit competitions in Reception, Key stage 1 And Key stage 2.
- Provide resources and equipment to allow children with Special Education Needs to access PE lessons and have opportunities for physical development.
- Provide professional development opportunities for teachers, enabling quality teaching and learning for all children.

- Provide coaches to improve the skills of mainstream and children with Special Educational needs.
- To run intra sports competitions between team colour groups to enable more children to have the opportunity to take part in competitive sport.
- Participate in inter school competitions to allow Gifted and Talented children to take part in competitive sport.
- Provide resources to be used in PE lessons, sports competitions and after school clubs to develop children's skills and interest in sport.
- Provide awards to celebrate the achievement and sportsmanship during all competitions and sports days and raise the profile of sport within the school.
- Provide equipment to be used by children with the support of midday supervisors, sports leaders and learning mentors for physical activities during break times and lunchtimes.

#### Effect on PE of the PE Grant Money 2013-14

North Beckton Primary school received £9280 allocated by the department of education designed and intended to improve the impact the school has on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment and to help to ensure that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles. The PE and Sports Grant has also given North Beckton Primary School the opportunity to again link with the Langdon School Sports Partnership which gives our children the opportunity to compete in inter-school competitions Borough and London wide. It also gives our teaching staff the opportunity to participate in PE training days to further improve the quality of their teaching in PE and Sport at North Beckton Primary School.

The information below outlines the outcome of the Grant spending in the different areas:

- As a result of the weekly class PE kit competitions in Reception, Key stage 1 And Key stage 2; more children are regularly bringing their PE kits and therefore are participating and enjoying being physical in PE lessons.
- Children with SEN are using the specialist PE equipment to help with their physical development and participation in PE lessons.
- Gifted and Talented children from Years 1 to 6 participated in 1 or more inter school competitions organised by the Langdon Sports Partnership. They enjoyed playing in a competitive environment and developing their skills against other schools in a variety of sports.

- The intra team colour sports competitions were run over 1 term involving 2 different sports. It allowed children from year 1 to year 6 to compete in a competitive environment. The children enjoyed competing against each other and strived to make their colour team the overall winner. The competitions were run by a team of 12 year 6 sport leaders. This allowed the leaders to develop their organisational and communication skills.
- New resources were used by pupils to develop sports skills during PE lessons, sports competitions, athletics club and playtimes.
- Awards given out during Early years and KS1 sports day, KS2 sports day, Year 5 and year 6 athletic finals to promote competitiveness and celebrate ability and success.
- Overall the grant has allowed children to look at sport positively and given children in North Beckton Primary School more opportunities to be more active therefore healthier.
  
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
