ON-GOING SAFETY MEASURES

We have reviewed our risk assessment in light of the latest Government guidance.

Some of the small changes this means are:

- children are now able to play outside with children from across their phase (not just children from their class)
- for some lessons, children might be in groups with children from other classes in their year group. The children will be sat next to children from their class, however, in case we need to support the 'track and trace' close-contact process. This will just be for lessons where the children across the year group might be a very different level for example phonics and maths.

Please continue to use the home-school book for any necessary communication with teachers in order to keep the flow of traffic moving through the playground.
