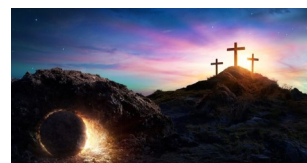

What does Shab e Barat (Night of Forgiveness) mean?

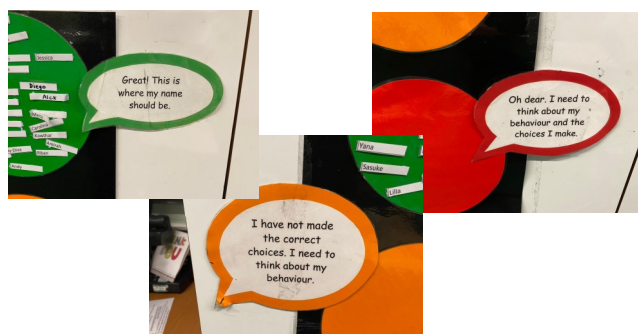


Please spend some time this weekend talking over some of these things with your children.
