

Newham City Farm Update

Newham City Farm was the only place in Newham accessible to schools and residents to interact, volunteer, undertake work experience, learn about animals and access the therapeutic benefits of them. Many members of the community have been severely negatively impacted by its closure, especially children, those experiencing mental health as well as children adults with SENDMH & their Carers.

The details for the next stage of the community consultation for the Beckton Parks Masterplan, of which the Newham City Farm site are part, have been announced and will be led by Engagement Team and East Architects.

If you would like to see this invaluable community and educational resource reopened again for schools and residents to enjoy and benefit from please book to attend workshop 4 for Area 3.

Workshop 3 for Area 2 is a space used by Curious By Nature for Forest School activities and also includes Itchycoo Park with its wildlife pond, this would another useful workshop for schools and education providers to input into?

Co-Design Workshops for the Beckton Parks Masterplan

Workshop 1. Saturday 26th November: 11:00 - 12:30 - which will be concentrating on AREA 1: the lake and the surrounding park

Workshop 2. Saturday 26th November: 15:00 - 16:30 - which will be concentrating on AREA 4: the sports field and New Beckton Park

Workshop 3. Saturday 3rd December: 11:00 - 12:30 - which will be concentrating on AREA 2: the woodlands and Beckton Corridor

Workshop 4. Saturday 3rd December: 15:00 - 16:30 - which will be concentrating on AREA 3: King George V Park and the Newham City Farm Site

The workshops will feature a selection of engaging activities to help shape the architectural plans and drawings for the Beckton Parks Masterplan, including the former Newham City Farm Site (workshop 4). East Architects will be showcasing ideas developed from the Beckton Parks Playbook, with space for local people to feedback with priorities, preferences and other suggestions. The playbook indicated that there would be an "animal offer" but further details of what this might include were not made clear so it's very important that schools, community groups and residents continue to input into the consultation and make their views known.

Children are welcome at the workshops and refreshments will be provided. As there will be limited spaces, please sign up for the specific workshops you wish to attend via Eventbrite.

Drop-in sessions will also be available to everyone, including those who are unable to access Eventbrite or Co-create, during the first hour prior to the above workshops. This will an opportunity for local people to come and peruse and review the architectural drawings and ask questions to the Architects or Engagement Assistants present.
